

The term 'Representation' is a heavily loaded one; for it suggests a 'given' which the act of rendition duplicates in one way or the other. It is quite common to confuse the terms 'representation' and 'mimesis' as interchangeable notions, even though the two are not homologous. Representation entails a whole shift in focus from the author as the controlling agent to the scene of writing itself, including the social and historical forces that produce that scene, and the reader's imaginative faculty that comprehends and conjures the scene. It is 'representation' alone that can unfold itself in the reader's/recipient's mind, and it is through her/ his active 'imaginings' alone that the intangible becomes an image. 'Representation' therefore remains both an act of 'performance', and not simply an act of reportage. As mimesis presupposes a given reality that is to be portrayed in one way or another, representation responds to a realm of bricolage that has to be deconstructed and reconstructed at the instance of subjectivity. 'Representation' becomes both a 'performance' and a 'predilection'; for it can preclude neither the 'accretion of Power' nor its exercise. The very act of representation thus involves a series of inclusions and exclusions, disrupting the homogeneity of correspondence and adopting the dictates of ideology. The discoursal space devoted to the analysis of representation as a political act in the works of thinkers as

diverse as Judith Butler, Gayatri Chakraborty Spivak, Jacques Lacan, Michel Foucault, Georgio Agamben, Gilles Deleuze, Slavoj Zizek and the ilk testifies to its contemporary relevance.

Against such a background, the Department of English, School of Languages and Literature, Sikkim University, Sikkim, wishes to organise a three-day international Seminar, inviting eminent speakers from India and abroad, as well as scholars and students, to mull over this politics of representation.
